<u>Related Material</u>: Correspondence with Hilda Smith may be found in the papers of John Carmody and Eleanor Roosevelt. Related material may also be found in OF 444 FERA and OF 444c WPA in the President's papers.

Transcripts of four oral history interviews: interview with Miss Smith done by the Roosevelt Library, interview with Miss Smith by Ashley Doherty, Bryn Mawr, Class of 1971, and two interviews with Miss Smith and other individuals involved in workers' education by Alice Hoffman of the Pennsylvania State University Oral History Project.

With the exception of her FERA and WPA work, the Library has only fragments of Miss Smith's papers relating to her various activities. Other collections of her papers are located at the Wisconsin State Historical Society, Rutgers University and the Schlesinger Library at Radcliffe College. See the Appendix for an inventory of the Hilda W. Smith papers at Radcliffe.

Hilda Worthington ("Jane") Smith was born in New York on June 19, 1888. She received a bachelor of arts degree from Bryn Mawr College in 1910 and a masters' degree from the same institution the following year, having studied economics, psychology and philosophy. Later she continued her studies at the New York School of Social Work, earning a diploma in 1915. In 1916 Miss Smith became Director of the Bryn Mawr Community Center and from 1919 to 1922 served as Dean at Bryn Mawr College. In 1921 Miss Smith was named Director of the Bryn Mawr Summer School for Women Workers, a pioneer school in the field of Workers' education. Her growing interest in this area of education resulted in her appointment as Chairman and Director of the Affiliated Schools for Workers (later the American Labor Education Service), a group of cooperating resident workers' schools. In 1929, Miss Smith established the Vineyard Shore Workers' School at her family's home in West Park, New York. However after four years this school closed for financial reasons. In 1939, the Hudson Shore Labor School (formerly the Bryn Mawr Summer School) moved to the Smith property in West Park. No longer affiliated with Bryn Mawr, this school served both men and women from industry and the service trades. It was taken over by Rutgers University in 1952 and merged with its Labor-Management program.

Miss Smith worked for Bryn Mawr College and the Affiliated Schools until 1933 when she was appointed a Specialist in Workers' Education under the Federal Emergency Relief Administration. She became Director of the Workers' Service Program when the workers' education program was continued under the Works Progress Administration. Under her direction, centers were established in 35 states to train unemployed teachers, many with no prior experience in workers' education, in working with labor. Also schools and camps were organized to educate approximately 8,000 unemployed women. Jurisdiction over the latter program was transferred to the National Youth Administration in 1937. From 1939 until its termination in 1943 the Workers' Service Program became more involved in projects relating to national defense.

From 1943 to 1945, Hilda Smith was Chief of the Project Service Section of the Federal Public Housing Administration, an advisory service in education and recreation. She resigned this position to serve as Chairman of the National Committee for the Extension of Labor Education, an organization lobbying for legislation to establish a Labor Extension Service under the Department of Labor. Miss Smith worked for this proposal until 1951 when it became clear that the bill would not pass Congress. Later, she became interested in services for the elderly, working for the New York State Education Department on a program of Recreation for the Elderly. From 1965 to 1972 she served as a consultant to the Office of Economic Opportunity in Washington.

Miss Smith's papers at the Franklin D. Roosevelt Library date mainly from the period of her government service under the FERA and the WPA and include incoming and outgoing correspondence, memoranda, reports, minutes of meetings, records of office interviews, newspaper clippings, songbooks, student magazines, printed and processed material such as articles, publicity materials, procedural issuances, forms, and other publications, as well as school books and family memorabilia. Also included are copies of two manuscripts written by Miss Smith, "Workers' Education in the Federal Emergency Relief Administration and the Work Projects Administration" and "A Seven Year Narrative: My Years in O.E.O., 1965-1972." The papers are divided into eight series, as follows:

I. WORKERS' SERVICE PROGRAM: FERA AND WPA, 1932-1943

Incoming and outgoing correspondence. memoranda, reports, minutes, records of office interviews, statistical data, printed and processed material such as forms, procedural issuances, publications of the WPA and other federal agencies, newspaper clippings, articles, and teaching materials, arranged alphabetically by subject. An index roughly describing the content of these files, from Miss Smith's service in the FERA and the WPA, is located in Container 1. Incoming correspondence is located mainly in files on public relations, individuals, and states. Previously unarranged WPA material was interfiled among the existing subject headings. Files on schools for women, once a part of this series, were returned to Miss Smith at her request in 1964. A chronological file of outgoing correspondence, scrapbooks of newspaper clippings, and display materials are located at the end of the series. Related material may be found in Series II.

II. REPORT ON WORKERS' EDUCATION FOR FORD FOUNDATION

In 1952, Miss Smith received a grant from the Ford Foundation to compile the records of 30 years of workers' education. The records thus collected, with the exception of the FERA and WPA papers which came to this Library, were sent to the Wisconsin State Historical Society; Rutgers University received a duplicate set. This series consists of Miss Smith's monograph, "Workers' Education in the Federal Emergency Relief Administration and the Work Projects Administration," written under Ford Foundation sponsorship, accompanied by folders of supportive material arranged according to subject. This material,
